Stockton-on-Tees Food Power Network

Stockton-on-Tees Food Power Network is a group of foodbanks, pantries, eco-shops and charities working together to offer food support across the Borough.



Food banks operate on a referral basis and supply free emergency food parcels. Referrals can be issued by organisations such as Citizens Advice, your GP or a social worker. Community pantries and eco-shops offer affordable food, toiletries and household items at low prices without referral.
