
Hotspot patrols to combat antisocial behaviour

Hotspot patrols will take place across five wards in the Borough in a bid to combat antisocial behaviour (ASB).

High visibility, uniformed patrols will operate in areas that have been identified as having high levels of ASB, aiming to deter offenders and provide reassurance for communities.

Hotspot patrols will take place in Billingham South, Billingham Central, Roseworth, Stainsby Hill, and Stockton Town Centre wards.

The ASB hotspot pilot will run until the end of March 2024.



Changes will make it easier for working parents with childcare responsibilities to move into or take on more paid work, and will come into effect as follows:

- From April 2024 15 hours childcare support for parents of 2-year-olds.
- From September 2024 15 hours childcare support for parents of children aged 9 months to 3 years.
- From September 2025 30 hours childcare for parents of children under the age of 5.

Levendale Primary School rated 'Good'

Levendale Primary School has received a 'Good' rating in all areas from Ofsted. Inspectors found the school to be "calm and purposeful" with pupils consistently going "beyond the high expectations" set for behaviour and learning.

Headteacher, Mrs Joanne Lewis, said: "We are really proud of this inspection result and the incredibly hard work of all our staff, which is reflected throughout the report.

"It's wonderful to read about the children's attitude towards school and their excellent behaviour is a real strength."





New state-of-theart Peake building at Egglescliffe School and Sixth Form has officially opened

The £7.1m teaching block named after British astronaut Tim Peake was funded by Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council as part of its £57.7m investment programme to transform school buildings in the Borough.

The 32-classroom block includes zero carbon technologies in the design and purpose-built facility for art and music.

Are you a private foster carer?

Do you care for someone else's child under the age of 16 (or under 18 if they have a disability) for 28 days or more, and are not their parent or close relative? This may be a private fostering arrangement.

Private fostering does not refer to children on weekend or holiday visits, and it only applies if the arrangement has been made privately between the child's parent or guardian and yourself. Private foster carers can include relatives such as great aunts, cousins, a friend or neighbour.

If you live in Stockton-on-Tees, you must notify Children's Services if you have a private fostering arrangement. A social worker will visit to make sure that the child's needs are being met and make sure appropriate support is being given to both the child and the carer.

Helping children and young people boost their mental health


BMBF has used funding from the NHS to produce a booklet to help children and young people in the Borough with their mental health.

There is a thriving voluntary, community and social enterprise sector in Stockton-on-Tees, and we like to showcase one organisation from the sector in our "Spotlight On" feature every issue. For this issue, we're focussing on Andy's Man Club.

In 2016, following the tragic passing of their friend Andrew Roberts, a group of men made the decision to take a stand for men's mental health. Andy's Man Club was created, which now provides weekly services for over 3,000 men nationally.

The suicide prevention charity offers free peer-to-peer support aimed at men aged 18 and over. Suicide is the biggest killer of men under 50 in the UK due to the cultural stigma attached to men and their mental health.

The charity has recently come to Stockton-on-Tees, based at Redhill Family Hub in Roseworth where they meet every Monday at 7pm.

"We're here to help any men aged 18 plus with anything that causes them concern or anxiety" said Craig Simcox who helps to run the Stockton sessions.

"We're completely non-judgemental. You don't need a referral to come to us, and there's no expectation to come every week. You just come when you need to talk

"More and more branches are opening every month. If we can help one family to avoid the destruction of suicide, that's the goal as far as I'm concerned."

Low-cost food is available for families across the Borough thanks to the arrival of new hubs from an award-winning charity. The Bread and Butter Thing offers food at a price lower than you'd find in the supermarket at its weekly hubs.

And thanks to funding from the Council and Thirteen Housing, three hubs are now open in central Stockton, Thornaby and Billingham, with two more on the way.

The hubs offer three bags of food worth roughly £35 for £8.50, including fresh fruit and veg, chilled food for the fridge, and cupboard staples like cereal. You can also pay £5 for an individual bag or £17 for a six bag 'family' deal.

It's free to join with no commitment. Once registered, you receive a text message 48 hours before your hub's 'collection day' and simply reply if you would like to place an order. You can then pay for the food upon collection.

Warm Homes Healthy People

Support is available to help vulnerable residents in the Borough keep warm this winter

The Council's Warm Homes Healthy People scheme offers emergency heating, energy saving advice, welfare benefits advice and boiler repairs.

You may be eligible for a repair if:

 you are the homeowner and claiming a means-tested benefit

And you are any of the following:

- 65 or over
- under 65 and in receipt of disability benefits
- under 65 and have a long term illness made worse by the cold or live with a child (under five) who has a long term illness made worse by the cold
- living with dementia

Some repairs may incur a charge or be considered ineligible based on the boiler's age and condition.

Cleveland Fire Brigade is reminding residents to follow these simple safety tips this Christmas.

- Christmas trees and lights water living trees to prevent them drying out and becoming a fire hazard. Make sure sockets aren't overloaded and bulbs don't touch any paper or fabric
- Christmas decorations never hang decorations or cards on or around the fireplace
- Candles don't leave candles unattended and keep them away from curtains or other flammable objects
- Smoke alarms make sure your alarms are working correctly and test them regularly

Transforming our six towns

Read the latest developments in our ongoing work to reshape our six town centres.



Stockton

The demolition of Castlegate Shopping Centre is nearing completion, with all of the buildings on the site completely cleared to make way for the construction of Stockton Waterfront urban park.

Work is continuing to prepare the ground for the next stage of development.

Wellington Square in Stockton is also celebrating growing numbers following the opening of B&M as the final business to relocate from Castlegate. The variety retailer has filled the historic, vacant Marks and Spencer unit in the town centre and is the last of 31 independent and national businesses that have moved.

Wellington Square now has a vacancy rate of less than ten per cent and is celebrating a growing monthly footfall rate, which is up 20 per cent in comparison to pre-Covid levels in 2019.

The Council owned shopping centre has also extended a number of leases with existing tenants who are leading national retailers – showing an increase in confidence in remaining in a town centre location.

Public realm improvements to the north of Stockton High Street as part of the Stockton Northern Gateway Townscape Heritage Project have also been completed.

This includes the redevelopment of Tennant Square to create a more opening and inviting public space and the improvement of footpaths along Norton Road and King Street.

The public are now able to enjoy this open, attractive social space and the heritage interpretation in the square.

The project was funded by Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council and the National Lottery Heritage Fund.



Norton

Work has been underway to refine the design and costings for improvements to the southern end of Norton High Street. Following this, work is expected to begin on the scheme at the end of January 2024.

Billingham

Following the unsuccessful bid for Billingham Town Centre to receive funding from the Government's Levelling Up fund, the Council is continuing to explore alternative ways of bringing about redevelopment.



Yarm

Work on the refurbishment and conversion of Yarm Town Hall into a Heritage Centre including the opening-up and reinstatement of its iconic brick arches has been completed.

Yarm Town Council is now working on the fit-out of the internal exhibition space and development of the heritage programme, which will form Yarm Town Hall Heritage Centre.

Work is currently progressing on a design for the public realm improvements to Yarm High Street as a result of feedback from a public consultation in 2022.

The Council is also proposing to deliver an improved cycle link along Durham Lane in Eaglescliffe using Levelling Up Funding to connect key employment sites and surrounding residential areas. Find out more at:

Ingleby Barwick

The first phase of improvements to Romano Park in Ingleby Barwick began in July and are now complete. This includes the re-marking of the multi-use games area (MUGA), repairs to the playpark equipment and additional litter bins and benches.

New play items also include musical play equipment and new trampolines at ground level, so they are easy to get on and off.

A community growing area on the extended land adjacent to All Saints Academy has been installed in order for pop up shops and stalls to trade there.

The second phase of works, including the installation of two new feature play items, the dragon fort and climbing 'bloqx' will take place this month.

This scheme has been developed following feedback from a public consultation in 2022.

Thornaby

The demolition of Phoenix House has been completed as part of ambitious plans to transform the town centre with funding from the £23.9million Thornaby Town Deal. Demolition work began in the spring and the removal of the building will enable the creation of a new swimming pool connected to the existing Pavilion leisure centre.

As part of the Town Deal, the Council is also proposing to deliver a joined-up network of cycle routes across Thornaby to improve access to the town centre and cycle paths in the south of the Borough. You can find out more about the proposals at: www.stockton.gov.uk/thornaby/cycleways

Tees Active awarded Green Mark accreditation

Environmental Sustainability and **Carbon Reduction Strategy**

2022 - 2032

Tees Active has received national recognition for its "ambitious and innovative" work to be more environmentally sustainable.

The charitable trust has been awarded 'Level 1' status from Green Mark, who work to help organisations achieve long-term sustainability goals.



The installation of 90 solar panels on the roof at IB Leisure in Ingleby Barwick is now complete.

These solar panels will create renewable energy and are expected to reduce the centre's energy costs by an estimated £22,167 per annum, based on current utility





Trees in Stockton-on-Tees

Over the last two years we have planted more than 20,000 trees across Stockton-on-Tees and over the coming winter we expect to plant at least another 7,100. Planting these trees will contribute to the Council's net zero ambitions and will also help add more woodland cover, provide wildlife habitats and increase biodiversity.

New NHS diagnostic facility for Stockton

Building works have started on an NHS Tees Valley health centre in Stockton, offering health checks, tests and scans.

The state-of-the-art health centre will be constructed on the former Castlegate Shopping Centre site in Stockton Town Centre.

The centre will provide rapid tests for a range of health issues, including cancer, heart and lung disease and will sit on the southern end of the site as part of wider transformation of the High Street being led by Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council.

The scheme is being led by North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust and South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board and NTH Solutions.

The centre is expected to open in summer 2024.

Plans underway for Care and Health Innovation Zone

Ambitious plans to develop a Care and Health Innovation Zone in Stockton-on-Tees are underway. The Council's vision for the innovation zone sets out proposals to create a nationally significant cluster of social care and health provision at Teesdale Business Park and the nearby Tees Marshalling Yards.

If realised, the proposals will transform the area, developing the 110 hectare brownfield site into a home for social care and health services, sector-specific businesses, research, teaching and learning facilities and housing to meet local needs.

The aim of the zone is to help address skills shortages and there's also huge potential for boosting the Borough and Tees Valley's economy, with projections showing that the site would be set to deliver thousands of jobs.

The next step is to set up a partnership board with representatives from the Council, Teesside University, Tees Esk and Wear Valley NHS Trust, North Tees NHS Trust, Education Training Collective (Stockton Riverside College) and the Tees Valley Combined Authority.



The works, which included debris cleaning, sign cleaning and pruning back plants and shrubs, were part of our ongoing programme to clean up the sides of some of the busiest roads across the Borough.





Drainage works continue at Durham Road and Thornaby cemeteries

Work to improve drainage at Thornaby Cemetery and Durham Road Cemetery has been undertaken.

Recurrent flooding has previously occurred at both sites after spells of heavy rainfall and worsened by the natural deterioration of the existing drainage systems.

At Durham Road, remedial improvements to the drainage have been topped with new paving to create pathways, allowing safe access for visitors. A sustainable drainage system (SuDS) basin, to manage collected water from rainfall, has been added. It will be planted up in the coming months which will aid to the management of the water.

At Thornaby cemetery, the team have installed underground drainage networks as well a new drainage system. They have also undertaken gully clearing and the existing drainage has been flushed through to help future standing water drain away more quickly.

Selective Licensing Scheme Consultation

Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council is considering introducing Selective Licensing of private rented properties in three areas of the Borough: Central Stockton, North Thornaby and Newtown. We believe there are benefits for landlords, tenants and the wider community with this scheme.




